What are Kids 'Skills?

Who can use it?

However, the method is simple and safe, even parents with their children can use it with minimal professional guidance.

What is the basic idea behind Kids'Skills?

Adults tend to see problems as symptoms of an underlying disorder that needs to be treated, while children tend to see problems as a lack of skills that need to be learned. Kids'Skills adhere to a child's perspective. It aims to encourage and help children gain the skills they need to overcome challenges. As the method involves recruiting family, school, and friends to support the child, it has an impact not only on the child but on their entire social network.

Skill Learning objectives are the intended purposes and desired outcomes of a particular course that generally identify the knowledge, skills, and abilities that students should achieve in a given class.

Life skills activities to incorporate into your child's daily routine

1: Budgeting skill

Talking to children about budgeting gives them control over their money – now and in the future.

It helps children understand that money is limited and they have to decide what to spend on and when to save. Budgeting shows that they can't have everything at once, but they can plan to save for things in the future. Budgeting is a useful habit to learn early before you start juggling money around your monthly salary.

What is budgeting?

A budget is a saving and spending plan.

Spend

It looks at the money you get and the money you want to spend. By comparing the money coming in and going out, you can see what you can afford to spend or where you need to cut back.

If you don't have enough money to buy something right now, a budget can show how long it will take to save enough.



Save

A budget can also show how you can reach your savings goal faster if you earn more or spend less. On the other hand, if you spend like crazy, you may never earn enough!

For children, a budget can show how they can stretch their pocket money for candy and stickers to afford larger items. As adults, we base our budgets on basics like mortgage or rent, food, utility bills, and transportation costs, and then try to save for bigger items like cars and vacations.



How to start a budget conversation

You can explain budgeting to children as creating a plan to help people make the most of their money. Omar Ruiz, a marriage and family therapist with more than 10 years of counseling experience, suggests that food helps introduce and demonstrate the importance of budgeting to young children. Food is a good

example because it is a product that they consume every day and you need money to buy it.

"You can explain that budgeting allows you to know how much food you can buy," Ruiz told The Balance in an email. "Indicate that if you already have a certain type of food at home, the budget will allow you to use the extra money for something else you need or want."

To introduce the idea of budgeting to your child, you might want to try using the bucket system, certified financial education instructor Kari Lorz told The Balance in an email. With this system, you get three mugs or mason jars for your child and dedicate one to spend, one to saving, and one to gifting.



As they earn their own money, perhaps through the benefits scheme or even from the tooth fairy, they can put their money into one of these buckets. "They'll be able to see their money grow and still understand that the money is for three different things," Lorz said.

Details of the progress of the budget

To create a budget with your child, the first step is to focus on explaining the income.

Because younger children typically don't have a regular income, you can use your income or a hypothetical income example to show them how an income works. You can walk them through your expenses and show them how you subtract your necessary expenses from your income to see how much you have for other things like unnecessary spending and savings.

Depending on their age, they may have income from an allowance, part-time earnings, gifts from relatives, or money from the Tooth Fairy.

Next, ask your child to subtract their expenses from their income. If the number is positive, congratulate your child and explain that they have enough money to meet their needs and wants. If it is negative, explain that



they will need to earn more income to meet their goals or that they need to cut back on expenses.

2: Advertisement skill

About advertising and children

Children experience advertising in many forms – on TV, YouTube, apps, radio, billboards, magazines, movies, the Internet, online games, text messages, social media, and more.

And advertising to children works. For example, the more TV a child watches, the more toys they are likely to want and demand.

That's why kids need to learn that ads are trying to get you to buy something. Ads try to influence the way you think or change your mind about something. And advertisers are always trying to make their products look better than they are.

Small children and advertising

At the age of **0-2**, children cannot tell the difference between advertising and TV programs, YouTube videos, and so on.

And at the age of 3-6 children:

- Can identify ads and distinguish between ads and TV programs or YouTube videos

- May not be able to tell the difference between entertainment and some advertising on YouTube - for example, unboxing videos that mix a game with a toy promotion
- They may not understand that the ads are trying to sell something
- They tend to view ads as entertaining or useful notifications will not generally criticize advertisers' claims.



You can limit the effects of advertising on your young child by limiting the amount of:

- Commercial TV or YouTube they watch
- Time spent using the Internet or playing games on electronic devices.

Children of elementary school age and advertising

At the age of 7-11 children:

- Can understand that ads are trying to sell them something
- Can remember advertising messages
- Can recognize some persuasive techniques, such as ads exaggerating how good products are
- I don't always want to question what the ads are doing
- May not be able to tell the difference between entertainment and advertising on YouTube or social media - for example, videos of people playing a video game are designed to make you want to play the game too
- They may not always understand that the products are not as good as the ads claim, or that the advertisers don't tell them there are any bad points.

If you want to limit the effects of advertising on school-aged children, the most important thing you can do is talk about ads and encourage children to think about what they are trying to do.

It's a good idea to focus on the ads your child sees the most. For example, you can get your child to develop a questioning attitude towards advertisers' claims by asking them to think about what is being advertised. That is, what is the product in this ad? What is it for? For who is it?

You can also ask your child about the strategies that are used to sell a particular product. This can help your child see how the ad makes the product look good.

Here are questions to help children start thinking:

- Does the ad make you feel something – like happiness, a sense of belonging, or fear?
- Does advertising pay popular celebrities or sports stars to promote a product and make it more attractive?
- Does the ad connect the idea to the product – for example, does the ad make children feel more mature when using the product?
- Does the ad promote the product by giving you something for free—for example, do you get a toy when you buy a kid's meal from a fast food chain?



Children over 14 years:

- Can understand how the market works and be skeptical of advertisers' claims
- May not know that social media platforms like Instagram, Facebook, YouTube, and Snapchat collect user data that they use to target ads users
- May not be able to identify sponsored social media posts
- They may not have the skills to make judgments about political ads, especially during election campaigns.



You can limit the effects of advertising on teenagers by talking about how ads work to sell ideas as well as products. For example, some ads associate products with the "perfect" life that the people in the ads seem to have.

Older children can also begin to think about the subtle effects of advertising. For example, you can encourage your child to think about how advertisements

influence ideas about how people of all genders should look, wear, do, eat and drink. Or you can get your child to think about political advertising and how it works on people's attitudes about things like prosperity, justice, and so on.

Here are some questions to get older kids and teenagers thinking:

Are foods and drinks in advertisements healthy? Why aren't vegetables and fruits advertised as hamburgers? Do they reflect real life?

How does the information you post about yourself on social media affect the kinds of ads you see on social media?

It's a step up from the extremely basic video editor of the Windows 10 Photos app. You can edit video properties, and add scene transitions, filters, and various video effects. In this, OpenShot gives kids another level of video editing tools to work with, but it won't be a mind-blowing leap.

Teaching kids photo editing

1. Crop and resize

When kids share photos or embed them in school projects, they need to be aware of size requirements. Teaching them the difference between cropping and resizing is an important concept in photo editing. Tip: Resize if you like the image exactly as framed, but it needs to be smaller. Crop when you want to cut something out of the photo, zoom in on the subject, or change the dimensions.

2. Try the lighting effects

How voiding and filling skills develop

Your baby will start grasping objects around the three-month mark, but it won't be until he's 9 months old that he'll clumsily throw objects into containers. Until

then, she will build this skill by picking up and handling objects to get a closer look, feel their textures and shapes, and move objects from one hand to the other.

Advantages of dumping and refilling

What exactly are these newfound skills teaching your toddler? Unloading and filling activities seem simple, but they improve many critical skills:

They create fine engine control.

The more your toddler handles and manipulates objects, the more his fine motor skills will develop. Filling a box or bucket requires control over her fingers, hands, and wrists. Using different-sized containers and objects (including water and sand) helps her use different types of grips and levels of fine motor control.

It teaches cognitive skills such as cause and effect, problem-solving, gravity, and spatial awareness.

One of the reasons your toddler loves filling and emptying so much is that he is fascinated by what happens after the container is emptied. Her brain processes a lot of information when this happens, such as what happens to the objects, whether they fall the same way every time, and what she has to do to get them back. Outcome: Learn about cause and effect and problem-solving.

What's more, unloading and filling containers teaches her about gravity and spatial concepts like inside, outside, next to, and above.

They develop hand-eye coordination.

When your toddler places objects in a container, she has to coordinate what her eyes see with what her hands are doing. In other words, she's building her hand-eye coordination, which will eventually help her write her name, catch a ball, and tie her shoes.

Teaches beginning math concepts.

Your little one is experimenting as she fills and empties. He learns that eventually the volume of the container will be supplied to capacity and the objects will fall out. He will see that taking toys out of the bucket will make it less full than before, and adding toys will make it more. You can help her

understand these early math concepts by providing explanations as she plays. Now there's only one left. If I give one, it will be two!"

They increase concentration.

Filling and emptying require your toddler to focus on what they are doing. Because there is so much to learn, these activities will keep many toddlers occupied and focused for a while! You can extend the play time and keep her attention by joining.

The teacher loved it and encouraged them in it; my child enjoyed the social praise he received and therefore would put in even more effort, leading to more social reinforcement.

Here are some things we can do at home to teach our children to recognize their strengths and weaknesses as well:

Reinforce if necessary

Parents are the real experts on their children. Parents know their children - they know what is easy for their children and they know when something is a struggle for them. If you see your child trying to do his best, support him in his efforts. Empower them to try, push through, and not give up. It's not necessarily about a perfect score, winning a race, or being selected for the first team, but the skills they learn can become one of their strengths.

Challenge them if necessary

While it is necessary to reward our children when they try hard and do their best, a useful skill for a child to learn is to challenge themselves as this would help them improve, learn and grow. We can encourage these skills by leading by example ourselves. If you can do better (this goes for anything you take on), don't settle for doing as little as you can - challenge yourself.

Keep a journal

Help them think of something they did well, something they enjoyed, and maybe something they could improve on that day/week.
